







A civil ceremony and evening reception at The George in Rye, East Sussex

We wanted to incorporate Anthony's Australian roots into our wedding, so we named the tables after each of the Australian states.

The details... My mum and sister found some lovely, vibrant blue glittery butterflies that we used to decorate our simple ivory and teal namecards, before they were tied to the back of each chair with ribbon.

Place settings were also decorated with a single butterfly tied to a bunch of fresh herbs, and we added a few heart-shaped chocolates as a treat for our guests. Our cake was a three-tier double chocolate cake with white chocolate swirls. It tasted divine and looked wonderful decorated with roses, lilies and more blue butterflies as a finishing touch.

One of our favourite moments of the day was when everyone was being seated for dinner in the ballroom and we had some time to ourselves before being introduced as Mr and Mrs Smith.
